World Breastfeeding Week 2025

SGRRU College of Nursing Dehradun observed World Breastfeeding Week from 1st to 7th August 2025 on the theme "Invest in Breastfeeding, invest in the future".

In India 3 out of 5 newborns do not get to begin breastfeeding within an hour of birth, 1 out of 2 women is not able to exclusively breastfeed her baby, out of 10 infants do not get

mind and to raise awareness among people regarding the importance of breastfeeding and on

minimum acceptable diet along with breastfeeding after six months of age. Keeping this in

the theme "Invest in Breastfeeding, invest in the future" activities were organized for

nursing students, postnatal mothers, family members and the public by the faculty members

and students of SGRRU College of Nursing, Dehradun.

The event was conducted under the guidance of Dr. (Prof) G. Ramalakshmi, Dean,

SGRRU, SGRRIM&HS, College of Nursing, Dehradun.

The various activities planned and conducted were as follows:

Activity 1: Poster and Rangoli Competition

The programme was inaugurated by Dr. G. Ramalakshmi, Principal SGRRU College of Nursing on 2nd August 2025 from 10:00am to 12.30pm at Nursing College.

Welcome speech was proposed by Ms. Rebecca Priti, Professor followed by Poster and Rangoli competition on theme of breastfeeding week by the nursing students. 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize were given to the students in both Poster and Rangoli competition which was judged by Dr. G. Ramalakshmi and Dr. Rosaline Lilly. The prize was distributed by Dr. G. Ramalakshmi to the winners of the competition.















Activity 2: Educating mothers and caregivers on breastfeeding

An interactive health education session on breastfeeding, positions, technique, postnatal diet breast related issues etc. and it's important to mother and caregivers of newborns admitted in postnatal wards of SMI Hospital was conducted on 6th August 2025 by students of M.Sc. Nursing and B.Sc. Nursing and faculties of Obstetrics & Gynaecological Nursing. Mothers were educated on breastfeeding their babies, physiology of lactation, how breast milk works, latching and bonding position, care of breast before and after feed, contents of breast milk, expressing breast milk, difficulties in feeding and its treatment, nutrition for mother, position & technique and advantage of breast feeding to the mother and baby. Mothers and family members actively participated in this session and benefitted out of teaching. Concerns of the mothers were clarified during the session.





Activity 3: Awareness programme among the postnatal mothers and family members

Participant of skit do not only strengthen one's confidence to face the audience but also helps in developing awareness about importance of breast feeding and its myths and facts. Young learners are the best messengers to spread the awareness of the social and global issues and their voice do leave an impact on one's mind. To spread the message SGRRU College of Nursing had organised skit on 6th August at postnatal wards of SMI Hospital. The skit is based on World Breastfeeding Week theme "Invest in Breastfeeding, invest in the future". More than 20 new moms and family members were the part of the activity as necessary knowledge were provided and cleared the myths of breastfeeding by their act. A myth like first milk, the colostrum's is not good for the new born. Hence such plays are conducted to educate them. Postnatal diet was distributed to the postnatal mothers.




Event Highlights:
