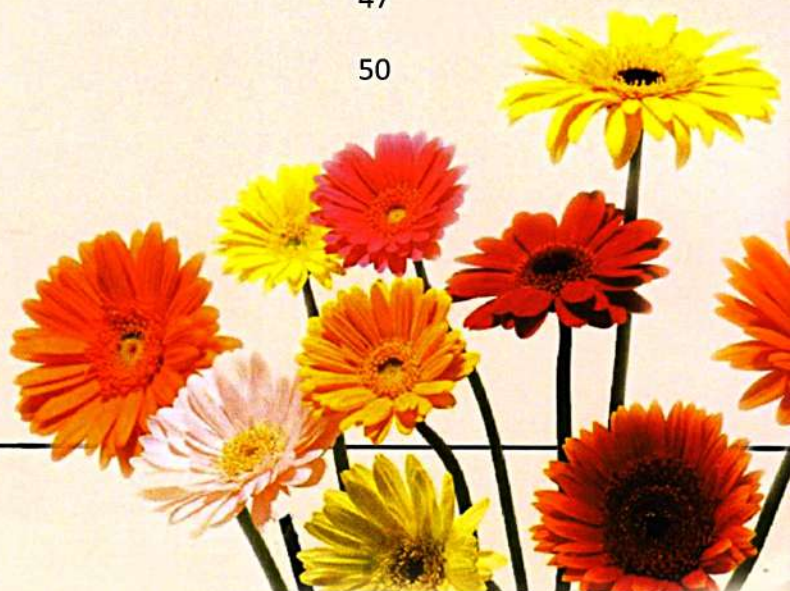

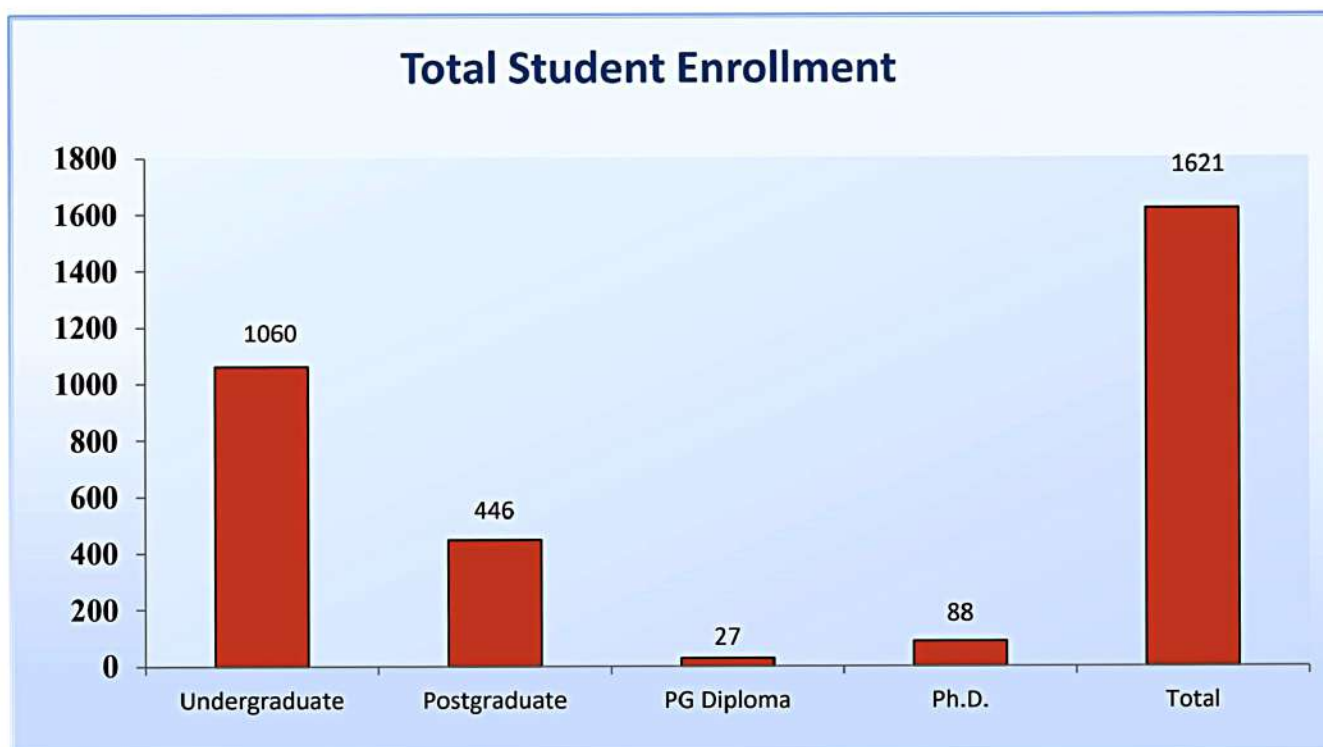




# STUDENT ENROLLMENT

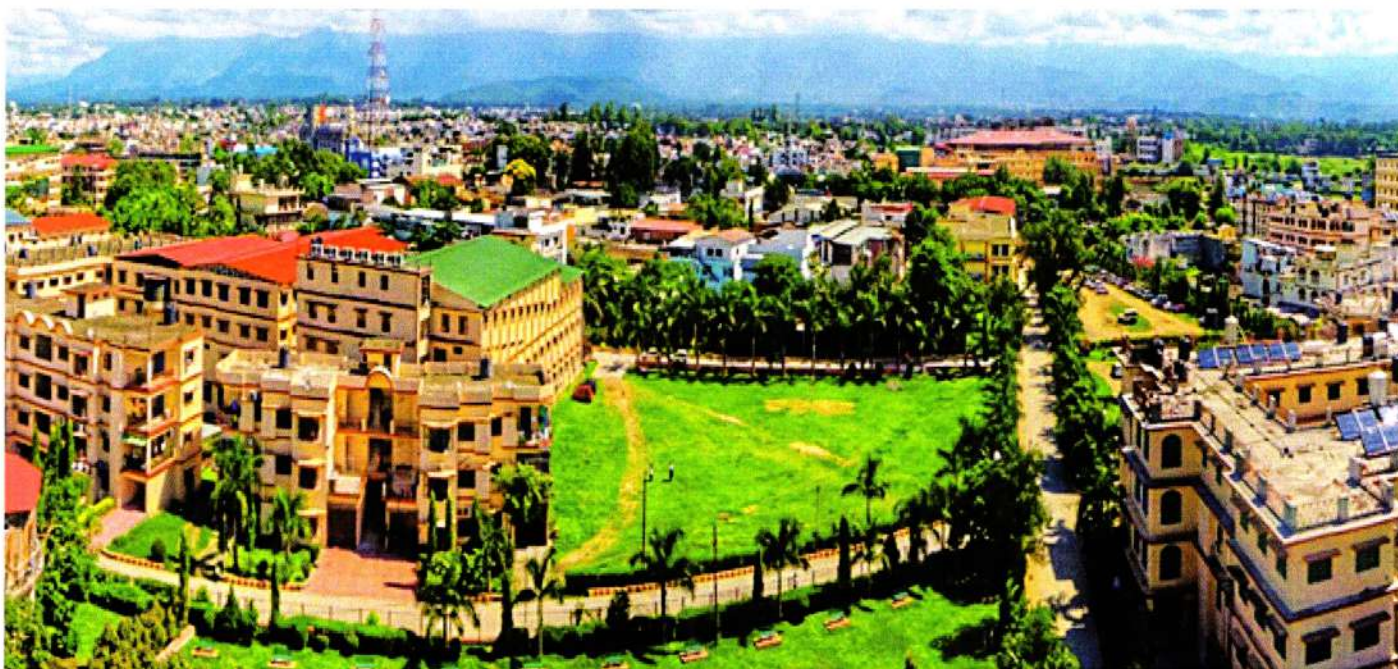
