MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

For facilitating

Training and Research

This Memorandum of Understanding (here in after to as MoU) is made on this -- day of -- month of -- year 2021 by and between ICAR (Indian Institute of Soil and Water Conservation, Dehradun having its location at Dehradun, [herein after called ICAR- (first party), a constituent research institution of the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, Krishi Bhavan, New Delhi-110001 on the one part and Shri Guru Ram Raj University, Dehradun [here in after called SGRR University, Dehradun/second party] on the other part. (The parties to this MoU are here in after collectively referred to as the parties).

The general objective of this MoU is to stimulate and facilitate the development of mutually beneficial programs which serve to enhance the research and training activities, intellectual life and cultural development on both campuses, and to contribute to the international cooperation. Thus, first party and second party will collaborate in the field of education and research.


Signature of Second Party

About the Shri Guru Ram Rai University, Patel Nagar, Dehradun.

Campus is spread over 80 acres and situated at education city Dehradun in the state of Uttarakhand. SGRR Education Mission took a promising stride in 2017 by establishing Shri Guri Ram Rai University under the SGRRU Act 2016 enacted by the Govt. of Uttarakhand. SGRR University having state-of-the-art infrastructure, best academic facilities and experienced faculty and follow time-tested internationally acclaimed credit-based system. All courses of SGRRU are designed to provide excellent learning, requisite expertise, rewarding qualification, and practical exposure, hands-on-learning and desired skills for a successful career.

Article 1. Scope

1. The second party will recognize the first party as an institute for conducting training and research related to the thesis requirement of the research students for masters/doctoral degree. The second party will recognize scientists of the ICAR IISWC as recommended by its Director in accordance with the university rules and regulations for guiding students working related to the said degree.
2. Research instrumentation facility and library facilities available with the first party and the second party will be made available to the faculty, scientists and research scholars. However, that costs of specific consumables will be borne by the respective organizations.
3. There shall be an exchange of students for academic, research and training purposes. Accommodation in the hostel shall be arranged, whenever possible, as per extant rates. The duration of exchange visits will be determined by mutual consent between both the parties.

Article 2. Management

- 2.1 Head of the first party and the Vice Chancellor/ Head of the institution or designated officials of the second party will be responsible to work out co-operation details of operation between the two organizations and ensure proper and effective implementation of this MoU.
- 2.2 The advisory committee will meet at least one in a year alternatively in the institutions of the first party and the second party to review the activities. This meeting shall include presentations on the academic and research activities which should be open to the students, faculty and scientists.

Article 3. Exchange of activities

- 3.1 Cooperate in the exchange of information relating to their activities in teaching and research in fields of mutual interests.
- 3.2 Endeavor to encourage students and staff to spend periods of time in the host institutions. The exchange of students will be dependent on the execution of a formal Student Exchange Agreement prior to commencement of this activity.
- 3.3 Conduct short courses, as mutually agreed in writing between the parties prior to commencement of this activity.
- 3.4 Conduct cultural projects, and mutually agreed in writing between the parties prior to commencement of this activity.
- 3.5 Conduct study tours, and mutually agreed in writing between the parties prior to commencement of this activity.
- 3.6 Exchange the students of undergraduate, post-graduation and Ph-D students. Such exchange may take place for a period normally of three academic years. The academic standing of such students shall be determined by the host institution.

The MOU shall be to achieve a broad balance in the respective contributions to the collaboration, and this shall be subject to periodic review by both parties. The parties agree to assist in the seeking of appropriate supply work space and other facilities as appropriate. The MOU shall include joint research projects and joint courses of study, with particular emphasis on nationally and internationally funded projects. The MOU shall include scientific or technical data, results and/or methods of research, and other information intended to be provided, exchange or arising under the MOU as required or pursuant to this MOU. The parties shall support the widest possible dissemination of agreed information. Each party in the MOU shall be given the right to use, disclose, publish or disseminate such information for any use all purposes.

General provisions
The parties agree that the first party and the second party subscribe to the principle of equal opportunity and do not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, age, cast or religion. Both parties shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and the MOU shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students which violate these principles. The parties agree that all financial agreements will have to be negotiated separately and the availability of funds. The parties agree that exchange of students from one party to the other shall be subject to the availability of funds and shall comply with the regulations and policies of the second party. The parties agree that any disputes arising during its term will be settled by the parties by mutual agreement. Disagreements at the operating level shall be forwarded to respective or appropriate resolution failing which an arbitrator of mutual consent shall be appointed for the settlement of dispute, if any. The parties agree that any disputes arising during its term will be handled by the parties by mutual agreement. The MOU shall not affect other corporation or collaborations between the

...admitted to the First party for training postgraduate research, if found guilty of the rules and regulations laid down by the First party and indulge in such activities that damage the image of the Institute, or cause damage to the property, the admission of such students would be summarily terminated. The Second party will not be responsible for issuing the certificates to such students until they compensate the First party.

...be charged from the students by the First party as per Guidelines for the conduct of research for their degree programmes as trainees at ICAR institutions (ICAR, New Delhi, 23/2017-PRB dated 13th December, 2017) or revised Guidelines, if any, issued from time to time. No fee may be charged by the First party from the students registered with Agriculture Universities/Deemed Universities WITHIN NARS. However, a student registered with the Second party and, outside the NARS will deposit Rs. 10000/- for training duration upto 3 months (not leading to a degree/dissertation), Rs. 20000/- for training up to 5 months leading to a degree/dissertation and Rs. 30,000/- per semester (up to six months) for training research duration exceeding three months. Any change in fee structure by ICAR will be applicable from the date of revision and shall be charged by the First party.

Article 10: Effect, modification and termination

The MoU shall become effective on the date it is signed by the parties and shall be valid for a period extendable up to five years. Both parties shall review the status of MoU at the end of each three years period to determine any modification, whenever necessary. The period of validity of this MoU may be extended by mutual consent up to five years. This MoU may be amended by mutual written agreement and may be terminated at any time by either party upon written notification signed by the competent authority of the party initiating termination. Such notification must be given to the other party in advance from the effective date of termination.

Any work or activities not completed at the expiration or termination of the MoU may be continued under the term of this MoU.

Any amendment or modification of the MoU shall be valid unless the same is made in writing by the parties or their authorized representatives and specially signing the MoU. The modification changes shall become part of the MoU and shall be effective from the date on which they are made/ executed unless otherwise specified.

Any dispute arising out of the MoU shall be resolved through mutual discussion between the officials of both the institutions.

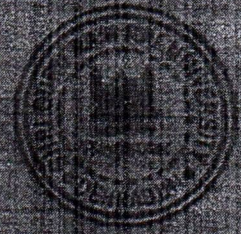
